We thank you for continuing to support our work. We look forward to the many good opportunities to come in 2023 and beyond.

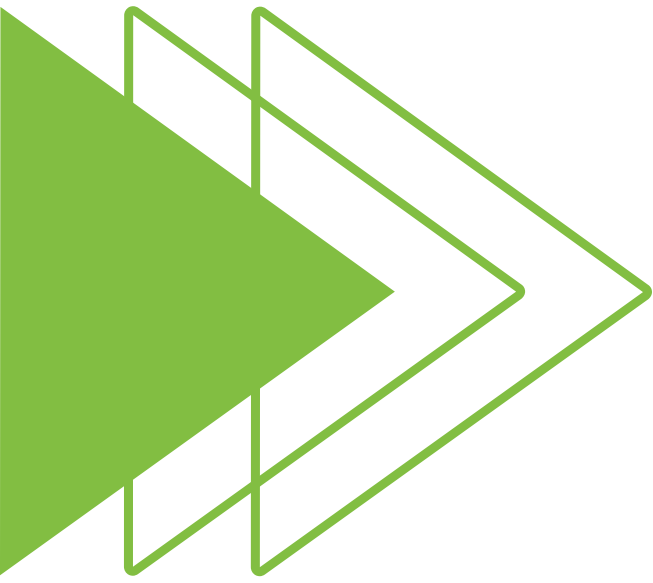

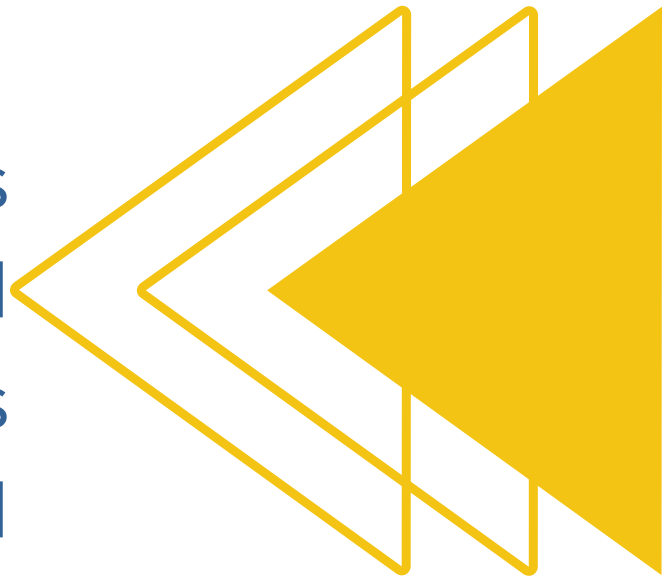

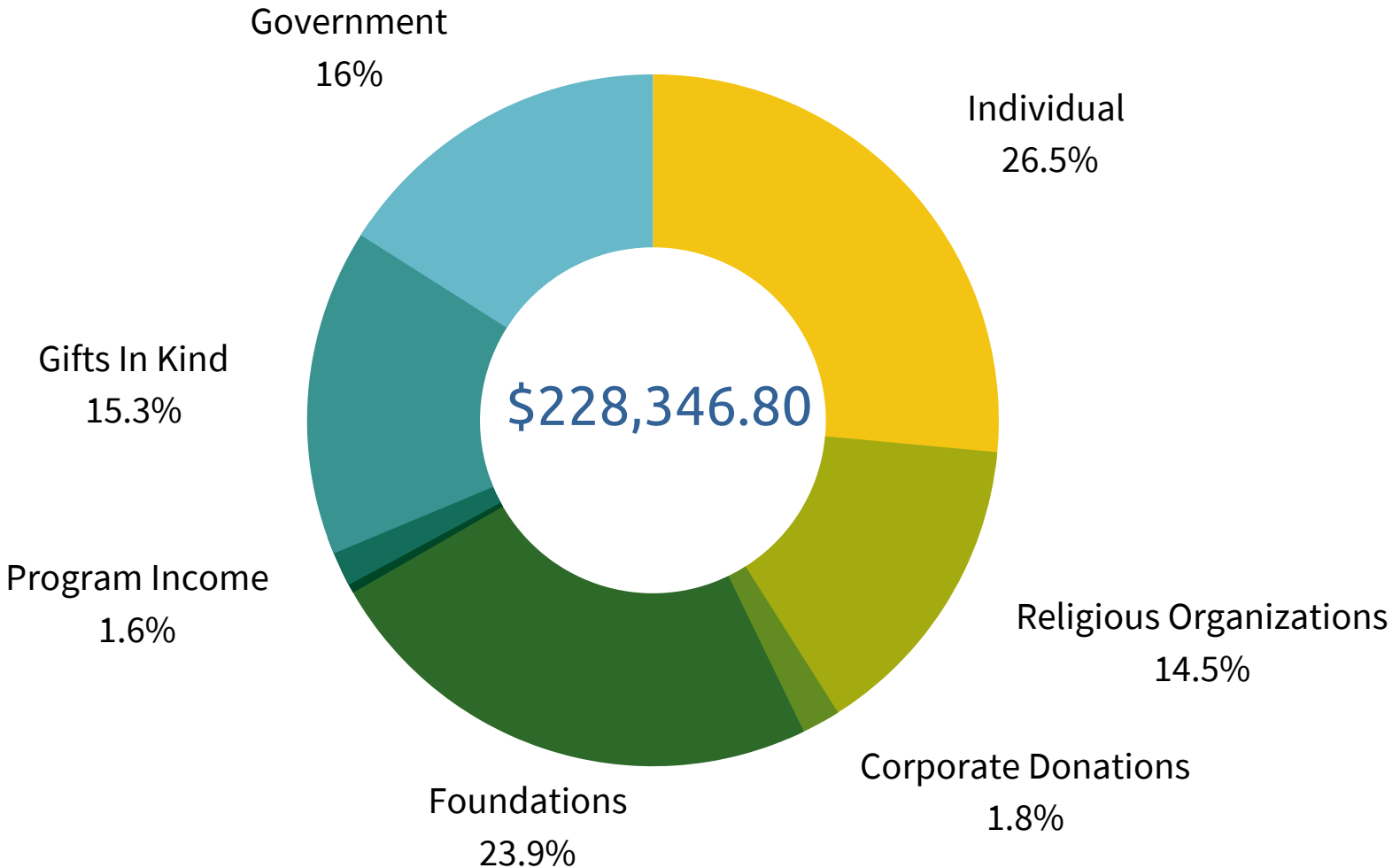
